CELEBRATING OUR FIRST ANNIVERSARY

Celebrating 1 year since our formation, we have grown to a full complement of staff, allowing us to ramp up support for the Sunderland voluntary sector.

A team of 10 have been appointed, headed up by Tracy Hassan, Alliance Manager, who has worked in the public and voluntary sector for more than 30 years and supported by a Board of Trustees responsible for setting and monitoring the strategic direction and impact of the Alliance. The board is almost complete with just one Trustee vacancy and another vacancy for the role of Treasurer, with both requiring someone with a passion for grassroots organisations and investing in communities, including marginalised groups.

Now with an independent chair, Sarah Reid, Managing Director, Richard Reed Solicitors, and a newly appointed board which includes six trustees from the VCFSE sector, Patrick Melia, Chief Executive, Sunderland City Council and Scott Watson, director NENC ICB and Joanne Gordon, Director Gentoo, the strategy is set to see the Alliance go from strength to strength. In April we celebrated with a development day with our Board of trustees to outline our vision moving forward and to celebrate our achievements so far. Our Operational Board and staff members all attended a celebration lunch.

Working together with strategic partners and anchor institutions in the city for the benefit of the voluntary and community sector, facilitating collaboration and maximising social value, the Alliance can support community and corporate volunteer recruitment, strengthen connections between organisations, enabling them to develop partnerships and keeping them informed with city wide information. More than 115 organisations have engaged with the Alliance in less than six months, accessing one to one support covering everything from business development, service strategy, budget planning, governance and management, bid writing and funding applications. With the launch of the free membership, we are now in a position to deliver on our strategic vision.

Our aim is simple, to funnel funding to an already vibrant VCFSE sector to ensure sustainability and to meet the needs of Sunderland residents, helping support a stronger sector and creating a stronger city.

REPRESENTING THE SECTOR

One of the key objectives of the Alliance is to raise the profile of the VCFSE sector at a strategic level. Over the past year we have discussed this role with our Trustees and our Operational Board members and are exploring ways to implement communication channels to encourage wider sector participation.

We are a member of the City Board sitting with anchor institutes from across the city to ensure the VCFSE is are not left behind and to look for opportunities for working more collaboratively together.

We are one of 3 VCFSE members on the North East and North Cumbria (NENC) Integrated Care Partnership (ICP). Earlier this year we delivered a presentation highlighting funding priority areas for Sunderland where there are gaps in service delivery and funding.

In September last year All Together Better (ATB) brought together partners to talk about Place Partnership arrangements to shape how things will work in the future. The Alliance has been part of these discussions and is a member of the Health and Care Alliance Transition Group which is now in place to oversee this phase of work. We have also had discussions with the Involvement & Engagement Lead who is reaching out to the VCFSE across the NENC area to gather information in relation to VCFSE sector delivery and funding implications to look at ways of supporting the sector in the future.

However without the close partnership we have had with Community Opportunities we may not have made the progress we did when recruiting and inducting our new team. Before we were in a position to directly employ our own staff Community Opportunities supported our recruitment, induction, HR and payroll services.

Community Opportunities (formally SNCBC) have delivered services in Sunderland since 1987, offering a range of community based opportunities for local families and residents including employability and training, community development, environmental programmes, volunteering, heritage, pre-school nurseries and children and youth provision.

A big thanks to Nikki Vokes and her team for the amazing support they provided the Alliance on its journey to independence. Going that extra mile really has helped us when we needed it most.



BREEZ AND THE TYNE AND WEAR COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

April and May saw Sunderland Voluntary Sector Alliance come together with partners to engage the sector in considering energy efficiency and to raise the profile of funding and investment opportunities.

In April we invited Graeme Stephenson and Andrew Atkinson to our office to talk to VCFSE sector organisations about the <u>BREEZ scheme</u>, this gave the sector a chance to talk 1:1 about their buildings and how to make them more energy efficient, bringing the Low Carbon conversation to the sector. Support was given to 13 organisations. "As with all things you're organising - an absolutely brilliant use of time and very grateful for your efforts in organising high-value opportunities to sit down and chat with specialists/ people with capacity to genuinely help. We're meeting with Andrew and his colleague in the near future to look over our community building - keeping fingers crossed."

Graeme Stephenson, Principal Energy Efficiency and Retrofit Officer at Sunderland City Council stated "It was great to promote BREEZ and VCSE EE fund via your organisation and the interest and uptake has been by and large very positive. We are following up 6 or 7 of the leads generated and hope these will convert into funded installations."

In May, Lindsey Hall partnered up with the Community Foundation Tyne & Wear and Northumberland to bring their 'Time to Talk' Session to the Sunderland VCFSE sector, enabling the sector to learn more about their funding application process. Facilitated by Community Foundation's Colette Harrison (Development Officer, Sector Support for Community), this informal session saw 14 attendees and received some great feedback.

"Exceptionally helpful to meet Pete and Colette from Community Foundation - great atmosphere and forum to learn and talk through thoughts. High-value use of time."

"I liked the back to basics information. It's easy to focus on the calls for applications but forget about the general applications which could be really useful. It's also great to hear about the additional support offered for pro-bono work."

Time to Talk sessions are open to anyone connected with a charitable organisation or support agency and welcomes volunteers, staff members, consultants, fundraisers and trustees. The event begins with a presentation about accessing support from the Community Foundation, followed by the opportunity to share thoughts, ideas and good practice.

SUNDERLAND VOLUNTARY SECTOR COMMUNITY TRANSPORT GRANT

With over 30 expressions of interest for this grant, it was evident we have an unmet need for transportation across the City.

Gathering local intelligence we identified a need for a flexible community transport offer to support the well-being of local people. Community transport has also been identified as a need to support social prescribing across the city and providing access to services that can reduce loneliness and isolation. Supporting individuals on low incomes, who are vulnerable or have a disability, to attend a community group, social or physical activities Providing a community transport service could impact the individual by:

- Reducing the need for specialist support services or medication.
- Reducing loneliness & isolation.
- Increasing mobility.
- Increasing the opportunity for friendships.
- Increasing opportunities for children and young people.

When transport is not available to support the above requirements health and well-being of individuals often deteriorates placing pressure on emergency and specialist services

As part of our strategic plan to collaborate, represent, include and invest we set about looking for VCFSE organisations that can do just that.

The grants are to support the following outcomes:

- Improve health.
- Promote connections, collaboration & co-production across Sunderland VCFSE sector organisations.
- Develop sustainable VCFSE sector Community Transport service.
- Strengthen communities.

Deadline for applications in mid May saw 21 submissions with all applicants to be advised in late June of the outcome.

We are certain this grant will be beneficial to Sunderland communities and the organisations that support them, and we look forward to giving a further update later in the year.

VOLUNTEERS WEEK

Volunteering in Sunderland has never been more important and valuable to both VCFSE organisations and the communities they serve. At Sunderland Voluntary Sector Alliance, we can support you with all your volunteering needs.

Other News

FORGOTTEN NORTH: LEVELLING UP POLICY AND NORTH EAST CHARITABLE ORGANISATIONS EXPERIENCE.

At Sunderland University Business School, we are currently conducting research on the 'levelling up' policy introduced in 2019 by the Conservative government. This policy aims to reduce inequalities and increase living standards in deprived areas across the United Kingdom.

As part of our study, we are seeking to capture the perspectives of charitable organisations as major players in the 'levelling up' strategy. Specifically, we aim to understand your experiences with fund allocation in the North East of England, hear the voices of local communities for comprehensive insight, and address the existing gap in understanding local stakeholder views and policy impact.

Therefore, we would greatly appreciate your participation in our study. Your data will be kept anonymous, and you can choose to participate in one part or both of our research methods, which include surveys and interviews.

TRANSPORT OPPORTUNITY WITH TOGETHER FOR CHILDREN

The scheme offers a unique opportunity to lease a wheelchair accessible minibus for free, in return for carrying out a morning and afternoon 'Home to School Route' (HTST) for students who require accessible transport to get to school. By participating in this program, your organisation will gain access to cost-effective transportation to use during the day, evenings, and weekend, as well as supporting the provision of accessible transport across the city.

Key features:

- Lease a wheelchair accessible diesel minibus for free!
- Gain use of a vehicle to support your day-to-day activities
- Your organisation will carry out 1 home to school route in the morning and 1 in the afternoon (route details will be provided by our SEND Transport Team)
- Fuel allowance provided to cover costs of HTST routes.

What to do if you're interested:

- All details will be advertised on the NEPO portal system w/c 3rd July. This ensures a fair and transparent process and will be in accordance with the Public Contract Regulations 2015.
- NEPO allows providers to view the commissioning opportunity, express interest and submit a response entirely online.
- If you are not yet registered, please register by visiting the website Body
- The NEPO system will take you through a step-by-step process to register and it is important that you select your categories of services that you are interested in delivering to ensure you receive notification of the right contract opportunities in the future.
