Durham Wildlife Trust (DWLT) is a charitable organisation that was founded in 1971, initially known as the Durham County Conservation Trust, it adopted its current name in 1988.

It is part of a federation of 46 charities throughout the U.K. Each Wildlife Trust operates independently, focusing on the conservation of local wildlife. These Trusts are built on a strong foundation of membership and volunteering.

The Trust has successfully protected some of the North East's most treasured landscapes, including ancient woodlands, heathlands, meadows, and wetlands, from destruction. DWLT remains committed to acquiring new reserves, fostering nature recovery across the region, and integrating wildlife into the heart of urban areas.

The work has now been completed and DWLT are extremely pleased with the upgrade.


